For a population to ( A ) itself in the absence of immigration, demographers estimate that there must be, on average, about 2.1 births per woman. In the United States, the fertility rate has been consistently below that level since 2007. And it's not alone: ( B ) some countries, especially in sub-Saharan Africa, are still growing rapidly, the global average fertility rate has been falling for decades, and even China's population, the world's largest, may very soon reach its peak. As a result, the United Nations now predicts that the human population will start declining by the end of the century. Some countries – notably Japan and South Korea, whose fertility rates are among the lowest in the world – are already shrinking. The trend is typically attributed to a combination of economic prosperity, which leads to lower infant mortality, and greater gender equality. "As women have gained more access to education and contraception, more parents are delaying pregnancy and fewer babies are being born," three researchers reported last year. Because many of those babies then go on to have smaller families than their parents did, they added, "the drop starts to look like a rock thrown off a cliff." It's a stark reversal of the demographic trends of the 1900s, during which the coincidence of high fertility rates and lengthening life spans caused the global population to nearly quadruple in size, from 1.6 billion to six billion. In southern Japan, one home has been recruiting an unusual class of workers to enliven its residents' days. These are "baby workers," as the nursing home's head calls them: 32 children so far, all under 4 years old, who spend time with its residents, who are mostly in their 80s. Residents strike up conversations with the young helpers. The babies, accompanied by their parents or guardians, offer the residents hugs. The visitors' reward? Diapers, baby formula, free baby photo shoots and coupons for a nearby cafe.

The facility, Ichoan Nursing Home, is in Kitakyushu, a city of 940,000 in Fukuoka Prefecture that is aging and shrinking like the rest of Japan. As families have become smaller and older people more isolated, the nursing home's baby worker program has helped people (A).

I come away with the impression that many men are like what Dean Acheson said about Britain after World War II. They have lost an empire but not yet found a role. Many men have an obsolete ideal: Being a man means being the main breadwinner for your family. Then they can't meet that ideal. Demoralization follows.

Ambition doesn't just happen: it has to be fired. The culture is still searching for a modern masculine ideal. It is not instilling in many boys the nurturing and emotional skills that are so desperately important today. A system that labels more than a fifth of all boys as developmentally disabled is not instilling in them ( A ).
