Anaximander is best known for his view that the origin of the world is the *apeiron*, an eternal substance, boundlessly large and without any \_\_\_\_\_ (A) features: neither hot nor cold, neither wet nor dry, neither white, black, nor any other color. Again, his reason for introducing such an unfamiliar origin for our world, in contrast to Thales' view that the origin of all things was water, can be reconstructed with some probability. The world around us is marked by contrasts: some parts of it are wet, others are dry, and so on. But if the origin of the world were wet, it is hard to account for the existence of anything that is not wet. The originating material must therefore not be either wet or dry, neither hot nor cold, and so on. It must, in fact, be \_\_\_\_\_ (B). Also, if it is the origin of everything, it cannot have a beginning itself: hence it is eternal. The Greek philosophers are unanimous in supposing that anything that is without a beginning is also without an end. And it must be boundlessly large in order to be able to generate not only our world but also an indefinitely large number of other worlds that, according to Anaximander, come into existence and perish at different times and in different places.

Researchers followed 31,750 men and women whose average age was 62 for an average of six years, using physical examinations and self-reported data on sleeping habits. They found that, compared with sleeping seven to eight hours a night, sleeping nine or more hours increased the risk for stroke by 23 percent. Sleeping less than six hours a night had no effect on stroke incidence. The study also found that midday napping for more than 90 minutes a day was associated with a 25 percent increased risk for stroke compared with napping 30 minutes or less. And people who both slept more than nine hours and napped more than 90 minutes were 85 percent more at risk to have a stroke. The reason for the association is \_\_\_\_\_, but long sleep duration is associated with increased inflammation, unfavorable lipid profiles, and increased waist circumference, factors known to increase cardiovascular risk.

You probably haven't given much thought to the pattern of little black dots on the edges of car windows. (A) Those black dots and the black rims that surround them do have a reason for being there. It has to do with how car windows are made. Car manufacturers started to use an adhesive to hold car windows in place, rather than metal trim. This adhesive got the job done, but it wasn't very aesthetically pleasing. Enter the black rims that you see around car windows, called "frits." The frits are made from ceramic paint. (B) The frits are there to hide the rather icky-looking, but very important, adhesive from view. Also, since these painted rims are baked into the window, they are all but indestructible. They hold the glue in place, which in turn holds the windows in place. (C) The dots get smaller and farther apart as the black recedes. This pattern is less jarring to the eye than opaque black paint juxtaposed with transparent glass. Their other purpose, besides the visual effect, is to provide temperature control. To get the glass of windows and windshields to be bent the way it is, the glass is heated up. The black-painted glass heats up faster than the rest of the window. (D) The dots are there to \_\_\_\_\_ the heat a little more evenly, which prevents the windshield from warping in the heat.

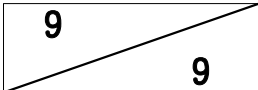
