W: Welcome back, students. Last time we talked about your favorite numbers. They might come from your birth date or the date of a special occasion in your life. Interestingly, some beliefs about numbers seem to depend on one's culture. Today, we're talking about what numbers symbolize in different parts of the world. In Asia, the number four is considered extremely unlucky, but Western people think it is promising. In Islam, the number seven is important.
